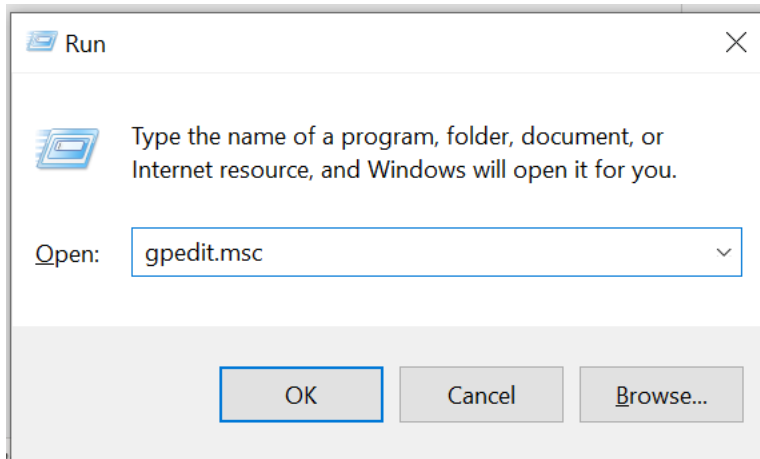


How to enable NTFS Long Paths in Windows 10 / Windows Server 2016 / 2019 or newer

How to enable NTFS Long Paths using Group Policy

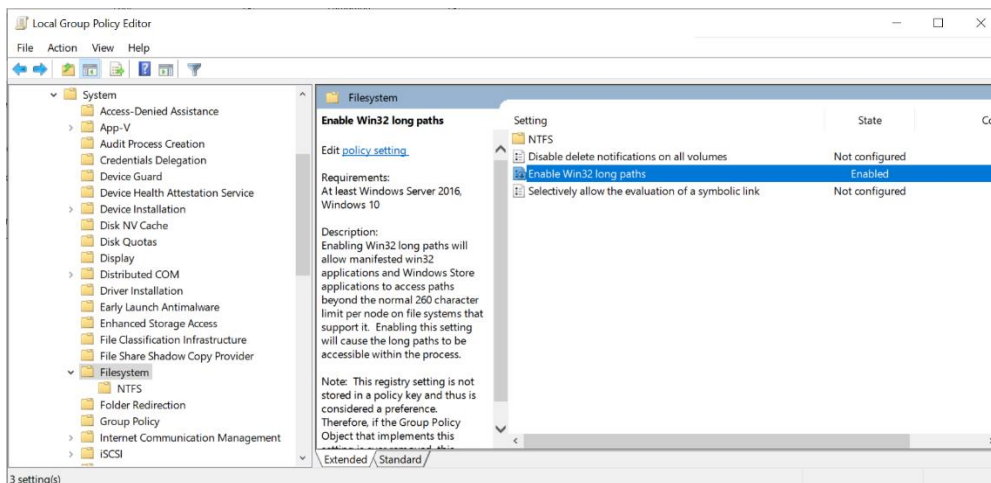
1. Press **Win + R** keys together on your keyboard and type:

gpedit.msc



Press Enter.

2. Group Policy Editor will open. Go to Local Computer Policy -> Computer Configuration -> Administrative Templates -> System -> Filesystem.
3. There, double click and enable the option **Enable NTFS long paths**.



4. Restart Windows.

How to enable NTFS Long Paths using Group Policy Registry

1. Open the Registry Editor.
2. Go to the following Registry key:

```
HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE\System\CurrentControlSet\Policies
```

If you do not have such a key, then just create it.

3. Create a new 32-bit DWORD value named *LongPathsEnabled*. Set its value data to 1.
4. Restart Windows.

How to enable NTFS Long Paths in Windows using the Registry

1. Open the Registry Editor.
2. Go to the following Registry key:

```
HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE\SYSTEM\CurrentControlSet\Control\FileSystem
```

3. Create a new 32-bit DWORD value named *LongPathsEnabled*. Set its value data to 1.
4. Restart Windows.
